Otamatea High School 2022 NCEA Results

Otamatea High School's 2022 NCEA results continue to outperform the national average across all three NCEA levels. Except for our year 12s, our Māori students achieved at significantly higher levels than the national averages.

2022 was an unusual year because of the amount of time some students had away from school. The government considers students to be attending school regularly if they attend school at least 90% of the time. Historically, about 60% of students attend school regularly, but last year only 46% of students nationally attended school regularly. If students are not attending school regularly, then their NCEA results suffer. The following analysis of our 2022 NCEA results shows the importance of attending school regularly.

As can be seen in the table, Year 11 students who attended over 90% of all their 2022 classes achieved the best NCEA results - with all students passing, and two thirds gaining either a merit or excellence endorsement. At the other end of the scale, those who

attended less than 60% of their classes did poorly, with nearly two thirds of these students not passing.

The pattern for year 12s completing NCEA level 2 is very similar. Of those attending all classes over 90% of the time, all passed, with a third gaining an overall endorsement. At the other end of the scale, those who attended less than 60% of their classes throughout the

year did poorly, with nearly 90% of these students not passing.

The year 13 pattern for NCEA level 3 tells a similar story. Of those that attended regularly, all passed, with over 80% gaining a merit or excellence endorsement. Those attending less than 60% of their classes throughout the year did poorly, with nearly 90% of these students not passing.
